staff said that the interview, due to go out to-morrow evening, should be recorded, because of the trouble which followed the Sex Pistols live interview with Bill Grundy on Thames Television's Today programme last week.

Tony Prince refused and was immediately suspended. He was due to open the English broadcast on the station to-night, but his place will now be taken by another D.I.
