

DJ suspended in punk rock row

DISC jockey Tony Prince was suspended by Radio Luxembourg to-day in a row over whether controversial punk rock group the Sex Pistols should do a live interview on the station.

Senior Radio Luxembourg staff said that the interview, due to go out to-morrow evening, should be recorded, because of the trouble which followed the Sex Pistols live interview with Bill Grundy on Thames Television's To-day programme last week.

Tony Prince refused and was immediately suspended. He was due to open the English broadcast on the station to-night, but his place will now be taken by another D.J.

He said at his Luxembourg hotel to-day: "I'm flabbergasted and very disappointed.
