A MOTHER today blamed police for causing the death of her 20-year-old son in a road accident.

They were giving evidence at an inquiry at Glasgow Sheriff Court into the death of David McAllister, of 41 Havelock Street, Glasgow, He died in hospital on March 2, nine days after being struck by a car in a hit-andrun

AN Aberdeen Industrial Tribunal today heard of a new rule which an Aberdeen fish firm introduced in April to prevent employees doing "homers" for other fish firms in their spare time.

Chief electrician Claben Limited, Mr Alexander fodd told the tribunal these homers" had previously een accepted practice. He said in April he was
