ALBUM REVIEW
The Clash: "The Clash"

PROBABLY one of the best bands to emerge from the 'new wave' era that has just swept through the country, "The Clash and their music should not be dismissed lightly.

Many people have come to the conclusion somewhat prematurely, that the 'new wave' bands have very little to offer. But don't you believe it. The Clash symbolise everything that is good about the brand of music associated with it.

High energy and high speed dominate the album, and although punk rock may not be everyone's cup of tea there can be no doubt that it is the biggest thing to sweep Britain since "Flower Power".

The straining vocals of Joe Strummer and Mick Jones along with their lead-voltage guitar work lead the way on stirring tracks such as "Janie Jones", "London's Burning" and "The Guns of Brixton" - fuelled by recently released single "White Riot".

The two group members, Tony Crimes on drums and Paul Simonon on bass, are superb. Intracacies one would not expect from such a group.

Lyrically not too clever, "The Clash" is a repeat of an interesting film by Yul Brynner as the robot guniting, who offers visitors to a holiday camp a chance to outdraw him. He sports blood and is then repaired in readiness for the
