TELEVISION, the American new wave band whose "Marquee Moon" album jumps into the Melody Maker chart this week, make their British debut at the end

They play eight concerts highlighted by a show at LONDON Hammersmith Odeon. And supporting on all dates will be the critically applauded American band Blondie, whose first album was released in Britain earlier this month.

The tour opens at GLASGOW Apollo on May 22 and continues at NEWCASTLE City Hall (23), SHEFFIELD City Hall (24), MANCHESTER Free Trade Hall (26), BIRMING-HAM Odeon (27), LONDON Hammersmith Odeon (28), PLY-MOUTH Top Rank (30) and BRISTOL Colston Hall (31).

The Bristol concert also features local new wave band, the Cortinas, who next month become the first group on a new label called Step Forward.

in the MM chart.


