Labour snub for group

The newly-formed North West County Council Association is being snubbed by Cheshire's minority Labour group.

Labour leader Councillor Jack Hayward has refused to nominate a minority group spokesman for the association.

Cheshire's Labour, Cumbria, Merseyside and Greater Manchester County Councils have formed the association to jointly try to attract more foreign investment into the region.

However, each council has just one voting member - in Cheshire's case, Tory group leader Councillor Allan Richardson.

Each council is entitled to elect two more non-voting representatives on the association, one from the majority party.

Independent Dr John Walley had been proposed to fill the unwanted vacancy, but the Tory leadership rejected his selection.

Red tape rap over queues in the rain

MANY Merseyside bus passengers have been left to queue in the rain because of bureaucratic red tape, an advertising chief has claimed.

The Liverpool-based firm Arthur Maiden Ltd have built 300 bus shelters throughout the M5PE area but the scheme has been stumped so far by the planners.

So far only 27 have been erected but the inevitable red tape of bureaucracy, they could all be up by now, said Mr Harry Harter, managing director of the poster advertising group.

"If the M5PE wants to put up a shelter, they don't need planning permission. Because we will have adverts at either end of the shelters we do. We applied over 8 months ago to the various authorities and we are still waiting for a decision on most of the shelters.

"We are not trying to hide the fact the shelters will eventually be paid for by the fact they have advertising on them.

"What annoys me is the amount of time it takes to make a decision," said Mr Harter.

It was even more infuriating when he read in last week's Echo a letter from a councillor asking how appalling it was there were no bus shelters at two stops in the area.

"It is farcical if they are crying out for shelters then why do the council not help us get them put up in all the areas waiting for planning decisions on the shelters in Liverpool and in the M5PE area covered by other councils

such as Sefton and Wirral borough councils.

Tony Mowbray, deputy planning officer for Liverpool said: "You don't need planning permission for bus shelters - these are advertising stations and many are in residential areas right outside people's windows.

"They are asking for advertising stations and we have to look at them very carefully. As for delay, they submitted them all at once."

Born in Salford, Miss Johns settled in Chester 22 years ago.

A regular contributor to the Echo, she also wrote several books, including her best seller King of the Witches, The Making Game and Zoo Without Bars.

Her funeral will take place at 10 a.m. next Tuesday at Blacon Crematorium.
