ig Science, New York City-based performance artist Laurie Anderson's debut album, is unlike any other LP released this year. It doesn't qualify as rock-both guitar and drums are conspicuously absent - but through the use of synthesizers and occasional horns, it often captures an ominous, doomy mood that suggests a cross between Pink Floyd and Captain Beefheart. Anderson's quirky song structures and evocative lyrics are fascinating, and her soothing altoshe talks a lot-draws you right in. But beware: this is more for the experimental-minded.
