
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

The book challenges existing interpretations of this period, resurrecting the dramatic last stand of one of the few rock bands that truly mattered. This was a moment where the band's struggles with punk ideals, Top Ten success, addiction, and personal/musical differences crashed head-on into a rising wave of rightwing power. In the process, a hopeful but ultimately heartbreaking tale played out, bringing an end not only to The Clash as a band but an entire era of political and economic struggle, and setting the stage for our world's present challenges.

WHY THIS BOOK Much of this story has been simply airbrushed out of the official Clash histories, and skimmed over in the more popular independent accounts. Two important works on this period, *Out of Control* (by Vince White) and The Rise and Fall of The Clash (by Danny Garcia) do exist. However, neither does what we are attempting here: going past autobiography or "Behind the Music"-style reportage, to dig deeper, taking a searching look at the band's last years, placing its story in the proper historical, artistic, and point in British--and international--history. This was when Thatcher broke the back of the National Union of Mineworkers, Reagan brought the world to the brink of nuclear war, and right wing politics "The Clash Mark II" seriously and place it fully in its stark, savage sociopolitical context. We have very high standards for this book, and are diligently striving to seek and speak the truth. We want to talk to all the key players, including movers and shakers such as Paul Simonon, Bernard Rhodes, and Kosmo Vinyl who have rarely spoken on this era in any depth. If necessary, we will delay completion of the book if this gives us a chance to reach such folks and get them on record. Above all, we want to write, research, and rewrite with care and passion, to craft a book that will be a true and lasting contribution to understanding The Clash and their era, as well as to passing on their rebel spirit, inspiring action in the "now." Our shared love for the music and message of The Clash spurs us on, driving us toward completing a book that, in one sense or other, we each have been working on since the late 1980s.

As we have discussed with our allies at Akashic, it is important to get this done on time; however, it is
