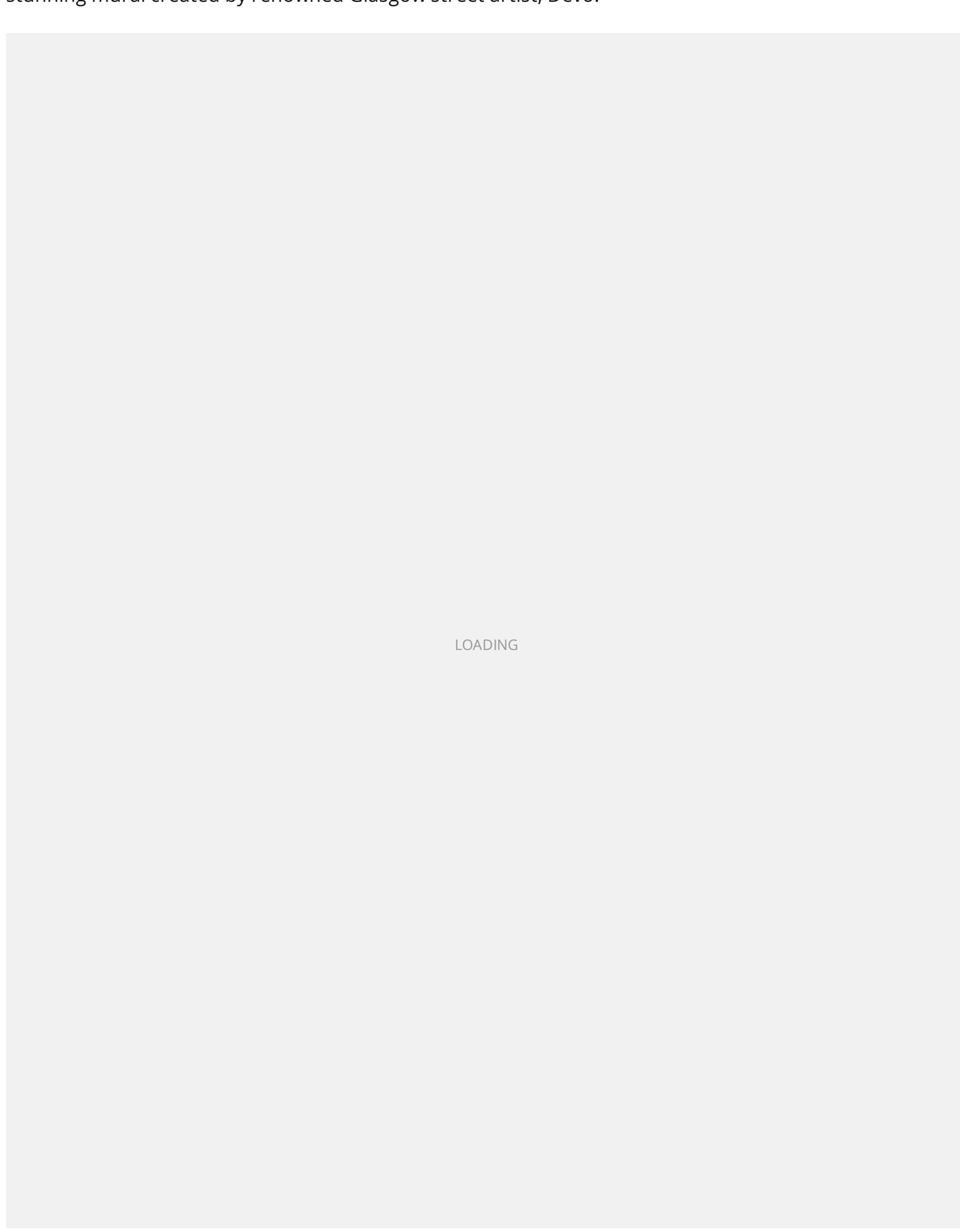

Any music fan in Glasgow will remember when The Clash performed a series of impromptu gigs in and around the city to promote their final album.

On May 16 1985 they played the Rock Garden pub on Queen Street, before heading to Dukes Bar on Old Dumbarton Road.

The following day, the band took their busking tour to the Vic Cafe Bar in Glasgow School of Art, then the Fixx Bar on Miller Street.

Their final venue, now known at [SoHo on Miller Street](#), has paid a fitting tribute to the band by unveiling a stunning mural created by renowned Glasgow street artist, Devo.

Marking the 40th anniversary of the release of their debut album, *The Clash*, the mural depicts all four members and has received a brilliant reaction from Glasgow punters so far.

"People are loving it," Michael Bergsson from SoHo told *Glasgow Live*.

"Glaswegians are mad about that band.

"Our post on social media has had so many views and shares - a Clash tribute group from Spain even shared it."

Last week saw the grand reveal of Devo's stunning art work, which reminds Glaswegians of a moment that will go down in the city's musical history.

"I've been working here for about ten years," Michael said.

"Although only a couple of hundred people were at the gig at Fixx - I've probably had about a thousand people coming in here, telling me they were at the gig.

"Maybe they were there in spirit!"

All joking aside, Michael feels the mural is just one example of the building's strong connection to the music industry.
